

What Is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment (DE) is a Georgia funded program that allows high school students to take college courses that can simultaneously count toward high school and college requirements.

- All high school students in a GA public, private, and eligible home school program are eligible
- ► Tuition, books, and mandatory fees are covered 100% up to a funding cap of 30 semester hours/45 quarter hours. (There may be non-funded fees such as parking, lab equipment, etc.)
- Funding pays for approved core courses (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World/Foreign Languages) and Career Technical Agricultural Educational (CTAE) classes that are aligned with identified career pathways.)

Who Is Eligible for DE?


- Students who attend eligible public, private, or home school high schools in Georgia
- ▶ 11th & 12th Graders
 - ▶ 10th Graders may enroll in approved Career, Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses listed on the Course Directory at a participating technical college
 - ▶ 10th Graders who have a minimum SAT score of 1200 or minimum ACT composite score of 26 in a single national test administration, may enroll at any participating DE college/university.
- Be a Georgia resident (no additional citizenship required)
- Meet college admissions requirements for their dual enrollment program
- Must be on track for graduation



Points To Consider

When considering the Dual Enrollment (DE) program, students and parents should understand the characteristics of students who are successful in college classes. Students who are considering the DE program should be:

- Sure about your reason for interest in DE
- Willing and able to take initiative
- Organized
- Mature
- Flexible
- Have good time management skills
- Must have transportation and parking
- Respond to and initiate communications with the college and Lakeside in a timely manner (within 24 hours or less) <u>Check Your Email!</u>





What Is The Process?



- Create your GAFutures account and select the Dual Enrollment Funding Application
 - ▶ The application approves participation and begins the funding process
- Schedule meeting with your counselor
- Review DE application process for the college you are applying to
 - Apply, Submit SAT/ACT Scores (if needed by college), Submit Transcript
- Complete "Student and Parent Participation Agreements" on GA Futures
- Discuss and finalize classes you plan to take with your LHS counselor
- ► <u>Important-April 15th Lakeside DE Deadline</u>
- Inform your counselor of college acceptance and provide copy of your schedule
